



'I don't know how to spin!' she said. She sat down, but she didn't do anything.


Three days later, the Queen came to see the girl. The flax was still there. There wasn't any thread. The Queen was very angry.

'Why aren't you spinning?' asked the Queen.


'I'm sorry, but I can't spin. I miss my mother,' said the girl.

The girl promised.




The three strange women went up the stairs and they saw the three rooms full of flax. They sat at the spinning wheel and they started to spin.

They worked all day and all night. Soon there was lots of thread.










Soon the first room was empty. Then the second room was empty. At last, the third room was empty! All the thread was ready! The girl was very happy and she danced around the room.


The three women said goodbye to the girl.

'Don't forget your promise,' they said.












The Queen wrote the names of all the guests on a list. The list was very long.
